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1. PURPOSE

Brisbane Christian College is a CRICOS-registered provider which enrols younger students under 18 years of age. As part of its registration obligations the College must satisfy Commonwealth and State legislation, as well as any other regulatory requirements, relating to child welfare and protection for any overseas student enrolled who is under 18 years of age.

These obligations include ensuring that all overseas students under 18 years of age are given age-and culturallyappropriate information on:

- who to contact in emergency situations, including contact number/s of a nominated staff member, and
- how to seek assistance and report any incident or allegation involving actual or alleged sexual, physical or other abuse.

Brisbane Christian College has documented procedures relating to child welfare and safety, and will implement these procedures in the event that there are any concerns for the welfare of a student under 18 years of age.

2. SCOPE

International students, homestay providers, homestay hosts, residents of homestay host homes, parents, legal custodians, nominated relative or friend.

4. **DEFINITIONS**

- Homestay provider: College, person or organisation arranging the homestay accommodation.
- Homestay host: The volunteer or paid family who care for the homestay student in their home.
- Homestay student: the child or young person (under 18 years of age) staying in the home of the homestay host.

5. POLICY

5.1. Accommodation and care options for overseas students under 18 years

Brisbane Christian College approves the following accommodation and care options for overseas students:

5.1.1. The student will live with a parent or relative approved by the Department of Immigration.

In this case:

- The College does not provide a welfare letter (CAAW) via PRISMS. The student's family completes Form 157N and provides proof of relationship to Department of Immigration at the time of visa application for approval of these arrangements. The Department of Immigration must also approve any further change of welfare arrangements.
- If the adult responsible for the welfare, accommodation and other support arrangements for a student under 18 years holds a Student guardian Visa (subclass 590), all obligations and conditions of this visa must be met, including:
 - a) not leaving Australia without the nominating student unless there are compassionate and compelling circumstances and the College has first approved alternative welfare and accommodation arrangements for the student for the adult's period of absence; and
 - b) advising the Department of Immigration of any change of address, passport or other changes of circumstances.

Brisbane Christian College requires holders of Student Guardian Visas to:

- maintain Overseas Visitor Health Cover for themselves and any dependent children living with them in Australia;
- immediately advise the College of any change to address or contact details;
- immediately advise the College if there are any compassionate or compelling reasons to travel overseas or not be at home for an extended period of time to care for the student.

If there is a valid reason for travelling overseas, and the College is able to approve alternative accommodation and care arrangements for the student for the period of student guardian visa holder's absence, the College will provide documentation approving temporary care arrangements for the student to the student's guardian and for the Department of Immigration via PRISMS.

If there is not a valid reason for travelling overseas, or if the College is not able to approve alternative accommodation and care arrangements for the student for the period of student guardian visa holder's absence, the student will need to travel overseas with the holder of the student guardian visa. In this case, the College will advise if compulsory attendance requirements will or will not be affected by the student's absence.

5.1.2. <u>The student will live in College approved accommodation and welfare arrangements and Brisbane Christian</u> <u>College will generate the welfare letter (CAAW) via PRISMS to accompany the student's Confirmation of</u> <u>Enrolment (CoE).</u>

Accommodation options that may be approved by College for full fee paying 500 (formerly 571) visa subclass students under 18 years of age include:

- Homestay Program operated by the College. Please see Additional Information, below.
- Private accommodation and care arrangements requested by the parent but approved by the College which meet all requirements under relevant state and commonwealth legislation.

Brisbane Christian College will maintain approval of accommodation and care arrangements until:

- The student completes the course and departs Australia;
- any appeals processes in relation to Brisbane Christian College's intentions to cancel the student's enrolment has been finalised (including suspensions, cancellations, course progress and attendance);
- the student has alternative welfare arrangements approved by another registered provider;
- a parent or nominated relative approved by the Department of Immigration assumes care of the student; or
- The College has notified the Department of Immigration that it is no longer able to approve the student's OSS-015: Welfare and Accommodation Policy - Page 2

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welfare arrangements and has taken the required action after not being able to contact the student.

Any accommodation, welfare and other support arrangements for the student must be approved by Brisbane Christian College, including arrangements provided by third parties.

Accommodation and care arrangements are checked prior to approval and at least every six months thereafter to ensure they are appropriate to the student's age and needs.

Any adults involved in or providing accommodation and welfare arrangements to the student have a blue card as appropriate (https://www.bluecard.qld.gov.au/).

Any changes to approved arrangements must also be approved by the College.

If a student cannot be located and the College has concerns for his/her welfare, the College will contact the student's parents / legal guardian and notify the police and any other relevant authorities.

If a student for whom the College has issued a CAAW refuses to maintain approved arrangements, the College will report this to the Department of Immigration and advise the student to contact the Department of Immigration to ensure visa implications are understood. If a parent / nominated guardian wishes to assume welfare responsibility, the parent / nominated guardian must notify the College as soon as practicable of their intentions and must provide the College with written evidence of a guardian visa grant.

5.1.3. *For School vacation periods, students under 18 years of age for whom Brisbane Christian College has issued* <u>a CAAW will:</u>

- return home to parents; or
- continue to live in / is placed in Homestay arranged and approved by the College; or
- apply for approval to spend the vacation with relatives or a friend's family; or
- apply to attend a supervised excursion, camp, etc.., if all requirements are met in order to attain College approval.

5.2. Accommodation options for students 18 years and older include:

Brisbane Christian College requires students over 18 years also maintain College approved accommodation arrangements for the duration of their studies at the College, such as the College Homestay Program or private arrangements requested by a parent.

5.2.1. *For School vacation periods, the following accommodation options are available to students 18 years or older:*

- Student returns home to parents;
- Student continues to live in / is placed in Homestay, details of which are recoded by the College;
- Student may spend vacation with friend's family or relatives, provided details are given;
- Student may attend a supervised excursion, camp, etc.., provided details are given;

5.3. Homestay / private accommodation arrangements at Brisbane Christian College:

The Homestay / private accommodation arrangements operated by Brisbane Christian College meet Queensland legislative requirements for child protection as well as Standard 5 of the 2018 National Code of Practice for Providers of Education and Training to Overseas Students.

These include

- Continuous dates for approved welfare arrangements;
- Documented procedures for checking suitability of accommodation, support and general welfare OSS-015: Welfare and Accommodation Policy - Page 3

arrangements before a student is placed in an approved arrangement, and at least every six months thereafter, covering:

- a) Guidelines for selecting, screening and monitoring each family and ensuring the family can provide age appropriate care and facilities for the duration of the student's enrolment at the College;
- b) Criteria about accommodation services to be provided, and contract for arrangements about providing accommodation services;
- c) Orientation program for families new to provision of homestay services;
- d) Compliant Homestay risk management strategy, reviewed annually, undertaken by school / operator of the homestay program.
- Blue cards as required for adults living in the homestay / private arrangement, other than overseas students, or who otherwise have regular contact with the student.

5.4. Driving and learning to drive in Australia

 Homestay students (including students over 18) are not permitted to drive or learn to drive while enrolled at Brisbane Christian College. Homestay students are not permitted to be a passenger in a car driven by a person on "L" or "P" plates.

5.5. Confirmation of Student Contact details

Applies to Overseas students on 500-student visa only.

Brisbane Christian College is required to maintain current contact details of all students and parents. This includes the current residential address, mobile number/s and email address.

This must also include details of who to contact in an emergency.

Students must advise Brisbane Christian College of any changes to these details within seven days while in Australia and enrolled at Brisbane Christian College.

Student's parents/guardians nominate their preferred contact email address for confirmation of the student's contact details in their Written Agreement when they join the College.

The International Enrolment Officer will send out an email reminder to all parents/guardians of overseas students every six months (at the end of Term 2 and at the end of Term 4) to ask parents to confirm their details. Calendar reminders and 'canned response' emails are set up to action this.
